EDUCATION

CBC's vision is to engage local area youth in learning positive and practical life skills that will allow them to steer toward a successful future, in college, the workforce or as leaders in their community.

Sea Lab:

Sea Lab is a marine science studies program funded through the New Bedford Public Schools for the perpetuation of real science activities. Sea Lab has an academic year program that exposes all grade five students to the realm of marine and aquatic sciences. CBC has had a classroom at Sea Lab since 2016. For the 2023-2024 school year we redesigned the program to be paired with a field trip to CBC once students have completed the CBC class at Sea Lab. The goal is that at Sea Lab, students begin thinking about different scientific concepts of boating and sailing. The class would take a field trip to CBC during the spring season and apply the concepts they learned in class to an actual sailing experience. There is a mathematical component to each activity at Sea Lab.

Students write hypothesis statements and practice recording data in tables and noticing trends in their data. Through Sea Lab we meet with almost all fifth grade students in the New Bedford Public Schools and work with students from every NBPS elementary school. CBC's Sea Lab program is aligned with:

- Massachusetts State standards for science
- Next Generation Science Standards
- Ocean Literacy Principles (Developed by the National Marine Educators Association)
- CASEL Framework for Social and Emotional Learning Elements.

During the 2024 school year, we worked with 862 5th grade students from the New Bedford Public School District



Sailing Into Knowledge

Sailing into Knowledge is CBC's hallmark interdisciplinary STEAM education initiative. Rooted in US Sailing's REACH curriculum and tailored to local school values and standards, Sailing into Knowledge blends science, engineering, math, and environmental stewardship through project-based learning on boats. Students explore physics through sailing dynamics, biology through plankton tows, and geometry through marine navigation.

Examples of Sailing into Knowledge modules include:

- Renewable energy measurement and system design
- Autonomous sailboats coded by students
- Aquaponics and aquaculture system development
- Underwater ROVs built from scratch using the SeaPerch curriculum

Boats By Kids

Since 2015, CBC has guided students through the hands-on process of building more than 20 full-sized boats, 400 wooden models, and thousands of paper models. Based on the “Building to Teach” curriculum, this project-based learning program teaches math, physics, and problem-solving through boat construction. Students develop hands-on skills with tools like saws, screwdrivers, and sanders while learning the skills and confidence to create something remarkable from start to finish. Annual boat launch days are always a highlight and a celebratory milestone that builds immense pride and confidence among the youth participants.

The Boats by Kids program expanded in 2021 to include skateboard construction and design, blending craftsmanship with self-expression and eco-friendly transportation.





SALT: SAILING AND LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

Launched in 2015, CBC's Sailing and Leadership Training (SALT) Program is our flagship workforce development initiative. In the summer of 2024 we had 77 participants in the SALT program.

Through mentorship, hands-on experience, and a focus on positive youth development, the SALT Program empowers young people with the skills, confidence, and leadership tools they need to thrive — both on and off the water.

The majority of CBC's Summer Youth Sailing program staff are in our SALT program, reflecting our strong investment in developing future leaders from within our own community.

Under the guidance of CBC's senior team, SALT Program participants gain real-world experience teaching, leading, and inspiring others. They serve as role models for younger sailors and help build a strong, inclusive community by bridging generations of CBC participants.

SALT: SAILING AND LEADERSHIP TRAINING PROGRAM

The SALT Program leverages the sailing instructor role by pairing it with a curriculum designed to develop seven key skill areas: Professionalism/Work Readiness, Problem Solving & Critical Thinking, Thriving, Networking/Mentorship, Teamwork, Communication and Leading to get youth the skills necessary for career and personal success — essential skills. Students can join the program the summer before they enter 8th grade and many stay working at CBC after they graduate from high school.

SUMMER YOUTH SAILING PROGRAM

CBC's flagship program, Summer Youth Sailing, is designed to instill positive life values, such as trust, integrity, sound judgment and teamwork. The program is accessible to all regardless of means. 88% of participants in 2024 received financial aid. Of the families who applied for financial aid directly through CBC, 62% were in the Extremely or Very Low Income Categories (annual income of less than \$49,800 for a family of 4.).

For 2024, we offered the following program enhancements at no cost to families:

- Two bus routes provided transportation to 243 youth in New Bedford, funded by Senator Montigny's Children's Equity and Empowerment Fund and the New Bedford Health Department
- Personal flotation devices (PFDs) were given to every participant
- Breakfast and lunch was provided daily through the New Bedford School Department's Summer Lunch Program
- A healthy snack was provided daily for each participant and instructor through a partnership with Coastal Foodshed, funded by the New Bedford Health Department
- A weekly painting project, taught by a local artist, was offered during lunchtime, funded by the GNBYS Summer Art Fund & the Southcoast Community Foundation
- Four after program field trips/experiences were offered to participants in partnership with the Rotch Jones Duff House & Garden Museum, Hazelwood Park Greens, Good Company NB & the Fishing Heritage Center



Summer Youth Sailing (Ages 7-17)

This program is for students who are both new to sailing and those who have a few summers of sailing experience. The goals are to have fun on the water and to learn and/or build upon the basics of sailing. Students have the opportunity to sail with an instructor and small group or to sail in their own boat with an instructor-driven safety boat alongside.



Sea Squirts (Ages 5-6)

Sea Squirts focuses on creating a comfortable environment with the main goals being water safety and having fun! We mix sailing, games and swimming to help our Sea Squirts build confidence in and around the water. Since 2020, this program has a literacy element using Dr. Seuss books. Each day the staff read one book to the children.



Windsurfing (Ages 9-17)

This program is for anyone looking to learn how to windsurf. CBC has a wide variety of windsurf rigs to accommodate people of all sizes. You can't be too big or too small!




Adventure Sailing (Ages 10-17)

Adventure Sailing is for students who are looking for a fun and exciting way to explore their local environment while receiving individual attention and guidance from their instructors. Students take part in destination sails and excursions. In 2024 we partnered with the New Bedford Department of Parks, Recreation and Beaches, Anchor Academy (a school of the Justice Resource Institute), New Bedford Police & Health Departments, Parker Elementary (part of NBPS), ASPIRE (a program of Child & Family Services), the Boys & Girls Club of Greater New Bedford.



YOUTH OFFSHORE PROGRAM

Our Youth Offshore Program gives young sailors the chance to experience the excitement and challenge of sailing bigger boats. Using our two 33ft sloops, participants gain hands-on training in seamanship, navigation, and teamwork while building confidence through real-world adventure. Every first or second year participant of our Sailing and Leadership Training Program spends one week in our Big Boat Boot-Camp to experience big boat sailing. During the Boot-Camp they sail all around Buzzards Bay and get to see destinations like Cuttyhunk and the Elizabeth Islands. Those who take to it join the team and begin team-building and skills training leading up to their first overnight sail. In 2024 our intermediate teams completed the 125-mile Ida Lewis Distance Race, NBYC Annual Regatta, Wednesday night racing at the New Bedford Yacht Club and multiple overnight training sails. We logged some 900 nautical miles in 31 days with over 40 participants.
